

APPEALS PROCEDURE / FINANCIAL HARDSHIP LANGUAGE

The Central Okanagan School District's Appeals Process Board Policy 460 – Appeals states that, "A student or a parent of a student who is entitled to an educational program in the Central Okanagan Public Schools may appeal a decision of an employee of the Board of Education which significantly affects the education, health or safety of the student". THE CENTRAL OKANAGAN SCHOOL DISTRICT'S FINANCIAL HARDSHIP CLAUSE

Within Board Regulation <u>425R – Student Fees</u>, the Board of Education has indicated "that a student will not be excluded from any educational program due to financial hardship". Clause 8.5 in the Regulations states: "Principals are directed to establish a procedure in each school which will allow for the private and confidential consideration of financial circumstances of individual students and families. Such procedures will preserve the dignity of families who may be unable to pay".
